Program overview – brief history

- Building on success
 - Postgraduate Certificate in Psychology (PCPsy, est. 1978)
 - For academically excellent students who are deeply interested in psychology
 - Master of Social Sciences in Psychology (MSocSc (Psy))
 - Inception: 2015 (in replacement of the previous PCPsy program)
 - With enhanced teaching and learning experience

Program overview – brief history

- Who is this program designed for?
 - For non-psychology students with a Bachelor's degree
 - Also, for students with a background of psychology who are interested in gaining more knowledge or research competence
- Objectives:
 - To acquire a solid foundation in psychology
 - To gain research competence
 - To prepare for career development in psychology and related fields
 - This includes to bring students to a level where they should be eligible to apply for graduate membership of the Hong Kong Psychological Society (HKPS), as well as should be eligible to apply for MSocSc in Clinical Psychology and in Educational Psychology amongst other postgraduate degree programs

Program overview – objectives

- Graduate membership of the Hong Kong Psychological Society (HKPS)
 - For career development in psychology:
One of the entrance requirements for the HKU MSocSc(Clinical Psychology) and MSocSc(Educational Psychology) programmes
- Requirements: a postgraduate qualification in psychology covering at least Research Methods in Psychology and 4 out of the 6 following fundamental areas:
 - (i) Biological / Physiological Psychology,
 - (ii) Developmental /Child Psychology,
 - (iii)Cognitive Psychology /Perception /Learning /Memory,
 - (iv)Personality /Individual Differences,
 - (v) Social Psychology, and
 - (vi)History of Psychology/Contemporary Issues in Psychology.

Program overview – key features

- An emphasis on research training
 - Two research methodology courses
 - An empirical research dissertation or a capstone research project
- Covers main subfields in psychology
 - Courses cover major subfields
 - From basic science to applied science

Program overview – program structure

- Dissertation option^{*}:
 - 8 Core courses + 1 empirical research dissertation
- Non-dissertation option:
 - 8 courses + 1 capstone project + 1 elective course

Note : an empirical research study is often but not necessarily required for being eligible to apply for further study programs. Thus, if one plans to pursue further studies but has not fulfilled this requirement from one's previous academic programs, one should check the relevant program requirements carefully and the dissertation-option may be considered.


Program overview – program structure

- For each of the 8 core courses:
 - 6 credits
 - One semester (~12 weeks)
 - 3 hours per week per course (**weekday afternoons**)
- For the dissertation:
 - 12 credits
 - From November to the end of June (~8 months)
- For the capstone project:
 - 6 credits
 - Enrolled in the second semester

Program overview – Dates of semesters

- Two semesters in each academic year:
 - Semester 1: September to December
 - Semester 2: January to May

Study mode – overview



Study mode – full-time vs. part-time

- Dissertation option – full-time mode
 - Complete within ONE academic year
 - Semester 1: 4 courses (spend 4 afternoons each week)
 - Semester 2: 4 courses (spend 4 afternoons each week)
 - Dissertation throughout the year (November to June) – deadline for dissertation submission is June the 30th

Study mode – full-time vs. part-time

- Dissertation option – part-time mode
 - Complete within TWO academic years
 - Year 1: 5 courses (2 – 3 courses in each semester)
 - Year 2: 3 courses
 - Dissertation throughout the 2nd year (November to June) – deadline for dissertation submission is June the 30th of year 2

Study mode – full-time vs. part-time

- Non-dissertation option – full-time mode
 - Complete within ONE academic year
 - Semester 1: 5 courses (spend 5 afternoons each week)
 - Semester 2: 4 courses (spend 4 afternoons each week)
 - Capstone project in the 2nd semester

Study mode – full-time vs. part-time

- Non-dissertation option – part-time mode
 - Complete within TWO academic years
 - Year 1: 5 courses (2 – 3 courses in each semester)
 - Year 2: 4 courses
 - Capstone project in the 2nd semester of the 2nd year

Study mode – full-time vs. part-time

- Tuition Fees (2025-26)
 - Full-time: HK\$182,400
 - Part-time: HK\$91,200 per academic year
 - **The tuition fees for 2025-26 is subject to University's approval**


Is this for you?

- Upon successful completion of the compulsory courses*, should be eligible to apply for:
 - MSocSc in Clinical Psychology
 - MSocSc in Educational Psychology
 - MPhil in Psychology
 - 4-year PhD in Psychology
 - Graduate membership of HKPS

Note : One should check carefully the requirements of the programs of interest and the final eligibility for applying for these programs relies upon the fulfillment of their specific requirements.





- A bachelor's degree NOT majoring in psychology
- ~~With No prior completion of similar conversion program in psychology~~
- ~~Bachelor's degree of HKU or equivalent~~
- Preferably have more than one year work experience
- English language requirement as detailed on the following page

2) The University's English language requirements are as follows:

Applicants with qualifications from a university or comparable institution OUTSIDE Hong Kong where the language of teaching or examination is NOT English are required to obtain:

(a) a score of 550 or above (paper-based test) or 80 or above (internet-based test) in the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL); or

(b) a minimum overall band of 6 with no subtest lower than 5.5 in the International English Language Testing System (IELTS); or

(c) grade C or above in either the Overseas General Certificate of Education, the International General Certificate of Secondary Education, or the Cambridge Test of Proficiency in English Language.

TOEFL applicants should request the Educational Testing Service (ETS) to send an official score report to the University (TOEFL code 9671) direct. The scores are valid for 2 years.

Application

After the submission of documents

- Mid-December 2024: notify shortlisted candidates for a qualifying exam
- 18th January 2025:
 - **Qualifying exam** (45 to 60 minutes)
 - to attend **IN PERSON** in HKU campus
 - MCQs and short-answer questions (in English) on basic concepts of psychology
 - reference for online psychology textbook https://saylordotorg.github.io/text_introduction-to-psychology/
 - individual interview will only be required on need basis
 - Early February 2025: Informal notification to successful candidates
 - September 1st, 2025 (Monday): First day of teaching
